

9:00 Circle: ANCIENT EGYPT Find Egypt on the globe and map. The ancient Egyptians ate barley and a grain called kamut. Kamut was discovered in an Egyptian tomb and was planted in the soil to see if it would grow. It did, and now, people eat it today. Make and eat kamut bread (or buy).

CRAFTSMEN AND ARTISTS OF ANCIENT EGYPT- Woodworkers, metalworkers, glassmakers, leatherworkers, jewelers, artists. Read *Ancient Egypt* 46-49. Demonstrate how to use a grid to enlarge a picture. (Make a small drawing of a profile on large graph paper and transfer it to a large grid on a piece of posterboard. Just make the same lines in the large squares that are in the small corresponding squares.) Demonstrate how you can use just one line to make the side view, or profile of a face. This is how the early Egyptian artists drew people.
